It is a pleasure to welcome you to Geneva for the EAO joint meeting with the Swiss Society of Oral Implantology (SGI), the Swiss Society of Periodontology (SSP), the Swiss Society for Oral Surgery and Stomatology (SSOS) and the Swiss Society of Reconstructive Dentistry (SSRD). 




