Welcome to Geneva

It is a pleasure to welcome you to Geneva for the EAO joint meeting with the Swiss Society of Oral Implantology (SGI), the Swiss Society of Periodontology (SSP), the Swiss Society for Oral Surgery and Stomatology (SSOS) and the Swiss Society of Reconstructive Dentistry (SSRD). This year is particularly special as it is the first in-person congress since 2019. It's very exciting to be back for a live event, complemented by a digital programme for those who are unable to attend.

The theme of the congress is **'Uniting nations through innovations'**. This will take a detailed look at when new techniques are beneficial and how they improve patient care. As well as a world-class scientific programme, there will be a wide range of social events. These include a lunch for first-time attendees, as well as an early evening get-together party for all delegates, plus a happy hour and other events.

Geneva is a truly international city and the EAO Congress will reflect this, with over 80 countries represented among the delegates and speakers.

We are certain that you are going to leave the congress equipped with valuable new knowledge and insights. We also hope that you will have had the chance to meet old friends and make new connections.

Enjoy the congress, and we look forward to meeting you in person or online.
